Conservatives are not the only ones that take issue with REAL ID, in fact the ACLU has come out against it and has created [REALNIGHTMARE.org](#) to inform the public about the dangers and problems with REAL ID. In brief, though REAL ID is a law passed in 2005 that states have struggled to get into compliance with for various reasons. REAL ID attempts to force the states to adopt federal standards in the issuance of state DL's. Doing this will allow the Federal Government to violate our right to privacy by demanding our information be put into databases that can be shared, not only amongst states, but the Federal Government as well as the UN as one of its agencies is helping to write the regulations. In order for KY to be in compliance with the Federal Government some legislators want to pass HB 77 to make our DL laws harmonize with the Federal Law. **Last year SB 245 almost became law, fortunately Governor Bevin listened to the concerns of the citizens of Kentucky and vetoed the legislation.**
